

## HISTORY

For over 400 years the Adam family has been farming their land in the hamlet of Ammerschwahr. In 1982, after finishing studies in Beaune (Burgundy), Jean-Baptiste V became the 14th generation to manage his family winery. He is considered one of the leaders in biodynamic farming practices in Alsace. Since 2010, Jean-Baptiste's daughter, Laure, has been an integral part of the business.

## VINEYARDS

The winery owns 17 ha (42 acres) and farms another 4 ha (10 acres) of vineyards, all farmed biodynamically. There are a variety of terroirs on the property, with two Grands Crus: the Kaefferkopf and Wineck Schlossberg and one great single vineyard called Letzenberg.

## WINEMAKING

All grapes are hand harvested. Fermentations are all from naturally occurring yeast. In an effort to maintain the purity of the fruit in his wines, Jean-Baptiste discards the first and last parts of pressing the grapes, retaining only the juice from the cour (heart) of the pressing.
