HISTORY

Triennes is the brainchild of two of Burgundy's biggest names, Jacques Seysses (Domaine Dujac) and Aubert de Villaine (Domaine de la Romanée-Conti). Convinced by their Burgundian experience that the quality of great wines resides in the vines, the owners invested enormously in the renewal and maintenance of the vineyards. Their goal with Triennes is to make refined wines that reflect the quality of their terroir.

VINEYARDS & WINEMAKING

The estate, which shows evidence of settlement and culture since Etruscan times, is located between 420-450 meters above sea level on a gently sloping hillside between the mountain ranges of Monts Aurelien and Sainte Baume. The vines leaning against Mont Aurélien face the Massif de la Sainte Baume, ensuring cool nights.

The climate is the classic warm days and cool nights that most exceptional appellations enjoy. The unusually long growing season virtually guarantees consistently ripe fruit with good acidities and great complexity.
